



AARP Driver Safety Course

Course Design: The program is designed for drivers over the age of 50. It addresses the specific risks that increase as driver's bodies change over time. While the course utilizes basic Defensive Driving Techniques, it emphasizes age-related physical changes in vision, hearing and reaction time. Typically, older drivers do not commit traffic violations such as speeding, drunk driving or reckless driving to any significant degree. Older drivers do, however, have problems when involved in driving situations requiring quick response, full vision and interaction with other drivers. Typical errors include failure to yield right-of-way, improper turning, incorrect lane changing, passing, and entering and leaving expressways. This course teaches attendees how to adjust their driving to compensate for these age related changes.



Target Audience: The "Over 50 Safe Drivers Program" has given proven results in reducing accidents by 10%. Successful completion of the course may entitle the attendee to an insurance savings. (Determining eligibility will be between the attendee and their individual Insurance Company)
